MANY SERVICES are available on campus for student use and support. **Campus office hours apply unless otherwise noted.** Check these out:

Yohe Library - The library is open to all students, faculty, staff, and community members residing in Merged Area XVI with a valid library card.

Computers for Student Use - A computer lab is located inside Yohe Library and these computers are available for student use during library open hours.

Student Support Center (Room 213) - If you are looking for a quiet space to study or need to make up an exam, go to Room 213. Please note: if you plan to make up an exam, an appointment to do so should be made in advance.

Academic Achievement Center (Rooms 206 A & B) - If the center is open during Summer Session, open hours will be posted outside the rooms. During Fall and Spring Semesters, tutors are available to provide you **FREE** assistance.

Enrollment Services Office - This department includes Admissions, Advising, Registrar, and Financial Aid, and can help you with enrollment needs.

Blackhawk Bookstore - Stop in and check out the many items that are available: computer software, supplies, clothing, all-occasion cards, chocolates, unusual gift items, and more!

Food Service - Closed during the Summer Session, services will resume with the beginning of the Fall Semester. For your convenience, various vending machines are located throughout campus.

SMOKING POLICY: Tobacco is taboo ... It's the law. Along with the Iowa Smokefree Air Act of 2008, SCC's Board of Trustees adopted a 100% tobacco-free policy. This policy includes all forms of tobacco, including smoking and smokeless. Smoking and chewing tobacco are not allowed inside any SCC building or anywhere outdoors on any property owned by SCC. THIS MEANS YOU SHOULD

NOT BE SMOKING INSIDE YOUR VEHICLE ONCE YOU ARE ON CAMPUS. Violators may be subject to actions as outlined by the College Code of Conduct and/or the 2008 Iowa Smokefree Air Act.

CAMPUS PARKING: Location does NOT always = Convenience

The West Burlington Police Department will ticket persons parking illegally in fire lanes (marked in red) and stalls reserved for handicap parking. Violators run the risk of being towed. Parking spaces designated as "visitor parking" have a 45-minute limit. All campus signage regarding parking restrictions should be followed. Violators will receive one warning. Subsequent violations will result in your vehicle being **TOWED**.

CAMPUS IMPROVEMENTS ARE UNDERWAY: Please use caution when approaching interior and exterior work zones. Also, please respect "visitor," "handicap," and "child care" parking designations for various parking spaces as plenty of parking is available in the north and west lots.
